Since the start of this pandemic there has been a great effort by people in Northwest Connecticut to make masks which have been in short supply. A grassroots network has distributed masks to healthcare facilities from Sharon to Waterbury. The Selendy Family also set up a 3D printer and have made high quality face shields. Lately we have been working with Congresswoman Hayes' office to distribute masks to people in need. This past Saturday she visited our farm to thank us and the mask makers for the effort. She was particularly glad to have a supply of masks to provide to a rural nursing home that was running low. Congresswoman Hayes also showed us a picture of her presiding in the U.S. Congress wearing a mask that had been homemade in her district. In these difficult times, we are fortunate to have elected officials who encourage cooperation and bring people together.
