

Minutes of the Cornwall Conservation Commission of May 19, 2022 held At 10:30 am conducted on Zoom Session

Commissioners in Attendance: Katie Freygang, Nancy Berry, Deb Bennett as well as supporting public member, Margie Purnell. Katie Freygang acting as chair for Heidi Cunnick.

Meeting was called to order at 10:35 am

The minutes of the April 21st meeting were approved. Special Meeting minutes of May 9, 2022 were posted on the town website.

Acting chair Freygang amended the agenda to discuss budgetary concerns before the end of the fiscal year 2021 and 2022 ending June 30, 2022.

- The remaining budget amount of \$2217 was reported by Treasurer Nancy Berry. There remain outstanding bills for the Barberry Hackathon (\$100) and the Van Doren Water testing unit (\$556)
- Nancy and Katie will meet to finalize the tally of the outstanding bills for fiscal year 21-22. They will present a program for Barbara Herbst about how to allocate pending budgetary items in order to issue payments before the fiscal year ends. Issues Ongoing issues are as follows:

Noteworthy Places

- It was noted that CHLA donated \$1000 to the Lake Committee separate from those designated by CCC.
- It was noted that these FY22 expenses will be approved in the next CCC meeting to be held on June 19th for payment by June 30, 2022.

Items Near Completion

- The By Laws discussion was tabled until Chairman Heidi Cunnick returns.

After noting the article in the Lakeville Journal dated Aug 28, 1975 on Cornwall Land Use as a supporting document to the subject of rural character had been completed by the statement sent to P&Z. The Commission welcomes any further discussion they need.

- The Horizon line and Ridgeline Protection project was moved to the folder of Program Monitoring as P&Z Chair Anna Timmell advised the Commission that they could not consider it for at least a year from this date. We await her go-ahead for this project.

Education and Outreach

- It was agreed that Margie Purnell would be repaid for the year for website hosting. The amount was \$170.
- Purnell and Bennett would research the CACIWC dues and membership for FY 22-23. Further there may be current dues to pay.
- Research coordination with CCT on new outreach programs It was noted that Phase #1 of the Welles Preserve trail marking had reached completion with the Trail Opening event on May 22, 2022.
