1. TRIP Grant

TRIP Grant application and map was shared on the screen and First Selectman Gordon Ridgway reviewed the following:

- proposed additions to Cornwall Bridge and West Cornwall to include crosswalks, sidewalks, signage, and speed tables.
- First Selectmen Gordon Ridgway had a conversation with Scott Thibault from DOT about protecting the covered bridge, he shared various ideas that people had including light beams, alarms, signage
- Steve McDonnell of WMC indicated that the waster water project should not impact the new sidewalks that go in

2. Essex Hill & Popple Swamp repaired & open

First Selectman Gordon Ridgway shared the following:

- Road is open and work is complete
- Photos of the completed work were shared
- No FEMA funding available for reimbursement for Essex Hill Region and State did not reach the required threshold for damage

3. West Cornwall Wall update

First Selectman Gordon Ridgway shared the following:

- Working with Engineer and Contractor and the Wall Construction Company to get the design on same page, still several weeks away from getting that completed
- Will have at least 1 week notice to let everyone know when the work will be happening

4. Budget – CVFD, Registrars, and more

First Selectman Gordon Ridgway reviewed the proposed budget and shared the following:

- Draft budget coming in at 5.9% high for us about \$135,000 increase about half of that increase is for health insurance.
- School is looking at a bigger increase than we are, our enrollment at high school is about the same, other towns are declining our share will go up
- May see withdrawal of significant amounts of funds from the town reserves to pay for storm damages
- Capital CVFD \$80,000 for trucks and \$20,000 for airpacks

Jayne Ridgway, Registrar shared the following:

- Due to legislation that passed last session, the statue requires early voting for primaries and general election
- Will be required to have each primary staffed
- Received a grant of \$10,500 to cover the increased costs, which needs to be spent by December 31st, 2024
- Increased cost includes increased salary, paying for workers, membership meetings/conferences, and getting room ready to be a polling place and a registering spot

John LaPorta, CVFD President shared the following:

- Decreased budget from last year
- New members need to be trained and equipment purchased for them existing members are continuing their training
- All vehicles need new tires approximately \$8,000 cost truck tires have lifespan and must be replaces after a certain amount of time old tires can go to the Town Truck

Gordon Ridgway - Made motion to send budget as drafted to Board of Finance, knowing that it needs work and we will decrease capital spending by \$100,000

Discussion - Discussion ensued on grand list and tax raises
