# Who can vote in the November Election?

US Citizens who are registered can participate in voting. Note: Former Cornwall residents who are US Citizens should contact the Town Clerk's office to determine eligibility

### **Important Registration Dates:**

October 18, 2024: Last day to register in person and mail-in. The Registrar of Voters will be open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. for in person registration. All mail-in voter registration applications must be received or post-marked by this date in order to be accepted. The Online Voter Registration System will also close on this date.

**Voter Registration for Early Voting:** Same Day Registration (SDR) is available at the Early Voting location during the early voting period (October 21<sup>st</sup>-November 3<sup>rd</sup>)

**November 4, 2024:** Deadline for admitting those seeking to vote in the Election whose qualification as to age, citizenship, or residence was attained on or after October 19<sup>th</sup>. Registrar of Voter's office will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
