## BITUMINOUS BID 2026

The Town of Cornwall, Connecticut is soliciting bids for bituminous concrete per ton complete in place for the 2026 construction season. All material will be Class 2 Asphalt and compacted, in accordance with Connecticut D.O.T. specifications bituminous concrete or equivalent. The placement of the material will be by a self-propelled paving machine capable of covering 18 feet width and compacted by a minimum 8 to 12 ton steel drum roller. All equipment must be to the satisfaction of the Highway Foreman.

The proposed project consists of three roads and (separate bid) for one section of sports area:

1) **Hall Road**

- Starting at #34 head east to Route 43
- 1,140 ft x 20 ft x 1.5" overlay
  - 2 key cuts needed

2) **Town Street South**

- Starting at Route 4/Furnace Brook Rd go north on Town Street South
- 1,230 ft x 14 ft x 2" overlay
  - 1 key cut needed

3) **Great Hollow Road**

- Starting at #295, go South to end of Cul De Sac
- 584 ft x 18 ft x 2" overlay – Cul De Sac measures 75 ft long x 34 ft at its widest spot x 2 inch asphalt thickness
  - 1 key cut needed

4) **Pickleball Court – Foote Field – Furnace Brook Road – Separate Bid**

- 64 square foot x 4" asphalt, Class 2 asphalt to be used for Pickleball Court

Town of Cornwall will provide traffic control, supply a water truck and notify CBYD.

**Work is expected to be completed by September 7, 2026.**

The Board of Selectmen reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to award in the Town's best interest.

The contractor who is selected to perform this State project must comply with CONN. GEN. STAT. §§ 4a-60, 4a-60a, 4a-60g, and 4a-68b through 4a-68f, inclusive, as amended by June 2015 Special Session Public Act 15-5.

State law requires a minimum of twenty-five (25%) percent of the state-funded portion of the contract be set aside for award to subcontractors holding current certification from the Connecticut Department of Administrative Services ("DAS") under the provisions of CONN. GEN. STAT. § 4a-60g. (25% of the total state-funded value with DAS-certified Small Businesses and 6.25% of the total state-funded value with DAS-certified Minority-, Women-, and/or Disabled-owned Businesses.) The contractor must demonstrate good faith effort to meet the 25% set-aside goals.
